I knew about hearing loss from a very young age, with both my grandmothers, and then my mother, having severe loss. At uni I discovered my own hearing loss, I wasn't ready to accept it so chose denial and avoidance and I could mask my difficulties well.

Years later working as a speech therapist I began to really struggle: I became anxious about mishearing the team during ward rounds and I found myself concentrating with all my might to hang on to the words being spoken.

After plenty of online research and reviews I chose Harley Street Hearing. Initially I felt so embarrassed so trialled the "secret" Lyric hearing aids. Despite incredible sound quality, they weren't suitable to me so the team made me a set of bespoke in-the-ear hearing aids which again weren't

quite right. With perseverance I now have my perfect fit behind-the-ear aids with high tech features -and I have never looked back.

They have made a huge difference to my life and my work. I can hear much clearer and louder and am able to adjust their programs/settings through an app on my smart phone when in noisy or lecture setting. The hugest plus is the way my aids connect to my iPhone, my iPad and my TV so that I can hear almost perfectly, I can hear telephone calls, podcasts, music, Netflix and audiobooks louder and clearer than ever before, I can hear the wind in the trees, the birds sing, and the engine of my car.

Being compassionate and patient with myself has been crucial but equally having loved ones understanding my hearing impairment is vital and prevents lots of frustration. A simple rule with my two teenagers at home is "don't bother shouting to me from another room; please come to the room and talk face to face or rather text, call or FaceTime me!"

The hardest part is acknowledging our own challenges and taking that first step. It's hard to crawl out of the denial and avoidance cycle and step into the light of awareness. But I now know for sure there is plenty room

Nelani's Hearing Tips For people with hearing loss

- Face the person who is speaking. For the most effective communication ask people to face you when they speak to you. This gives lots of extra visual cues which help us to decipher speech.
- In a restaurant or group situation request to be seated in the middle of a table in a quiet corner. This minimises competing noises and allows you to face each speaker for visual cues.
- If you have a better hearing ear, position yourself with this ear towards the speaker(s).
- Ask people to get your attention before talking to you. Do not hesitate to ask them to repeat themselves or speak more slowly or clearly.
- If you have hearing aid amplification and you are still struggling just call us for another hearing test and hearing aid adjustments, as a simple tweak may make all the difference.
